**The aim and scope:**

This panel explores how we should analyze the relationship between glocalization and regional development. Past research on glocalization has clarified that globalization does not necessarily bring about uniformity or homogenization of the world, but globalization always involves localization (indigenization). Additionally, recent research that has been attracting attention explores processes and mechanisms through which knowledge, value, technology, and systems fostered in local areas are transmitted to the wider world. However, not much research has been done on the relationship between glocalization and regional/local development. All relevant submissions are invited, covering both theoretical and empirical contributions to the topic.
