Call for Papers

Special Centenary Issue: Charles M. Tiebout

To mark the centenary of his birth, the *Annals of Regional Science* is calling for papers for a special issue in honor of Charles M. Tiebout. Born in 1924, Tiebout was already acknowledged as an important leading scholar during his own lifetime. Yet, his scholarly impact and renown has continued to grow steadily following his all-too-early passing in 1968. Tiebout's work permeates the foundations of contemporary scholarship in local public finance, urban demographics, political science, urban geography, regional development, input-output analysis and related fields of inquiry. The emphasis of this special issue is not about Charles Tiebout per se, but rather on exemplary research that best exemplifies the continuing relevance of his work for contemporary scholarship.

This special issue is being co-edited by Professors Steven Craig, Eric Heikkila and Geoffrey Hewings. To be considered for this special issue, papers should be submitted through the *ARS* portal no later than April 15th, 2023. Authors contemplating a contribution are encouraged to send a one-paragraph abstract to heikkila@usc.edu early on in the process for a preliminary assessment of fit.
